AC/DC has postponed its Friday, concert at the BB&T Center in Sunrise after lead singer Brian Johnson

ing to prevent total hearing loss. The Sunrise show was among 10 affected performances on the band's "Rock or Bust" world tour through April 4, when the band was scheduled to play New York's Madison Square Garden.

The announcement, made via promoter Live Nation, stated that the band would make up the concerts later in the year, likely with a guest singer stepping in for Johnson, one of the most distinctive voices in rock 'n' roll. Johnson, 68, has toured with AC/DC for more than 35 years, since joining the band after the death of Bon Scott.

Tickets will be honored for the new dates, but refunds are available at point of purchase.

Other affected dates are Tuesday, in Atlanta; Monday in Greensboro, N.C.; March 17 in Washington, D.C.; March 20 in Detroit; March 23 in Columbus, Ohio; March 16 in Cleveland; March 29 in Buffalo; and April 1 in Philadelphia.

History as seen by another

'The Moor's Account' tells tale of Florida's discovery from perspective of enslaved translator

In Laila Lalami's recent historical novel "The Moor's Account," a Moroccan slave bears witness to Spain's voyage to Florida's Gulf Coast, a slow-building disaster in which 600 conquistadors perish thanks to heat, disease, starvation and Indi-

Four crew members survived the 1528 Narvaez expedition to the New World in search of gold: three Castilian explorers and, more notable, Lalami's narrator, the slave Estebanico, perhaps the world's first black explorer of the Americas.

Speaking by phone from Los Angeles, Lalami says writing a fictional memoir from the perspective of a slave was driven by a "moralistic impulse" to capture the hubris of conquerors who became corrupted by greed, and give voice to the enslaved they conquered.

"When you read about the discovery of the Americas, all you know is that the Spaniards landed and con-

quered the New World," says Lalami, a Moroccan-born professor of creative writing at the University of Califor nia - Riverside. "But I realized these voyages were much more multicultural than historical records show, made up of Portuguese and Spanish conquistadors and African slaves." Lalami will discuss her

novel, a finalist for the Pulitzer Prize, on Wednesday, at the Mizner Park Cultural Arts Center, part of the ongoing Festival of the Arts Boca. She admits she wasn't fascinated with the conquistadors' discovery of "La Florida" until she uncovered the name Estebanico, who shared her Moroccan heritage, buried in the official testimony of the survivors.

In researching her novel, Lalami, who earned a Ph.D. in linguistics from USC, says she relied on the 1542 written testimony of Castilian explorer Álvar Núñez Cabeza de Vaca, whose reallife, very biased version of events left her puzzled. How could the four survivors (eventually picked up by

Spanish slavers in Mexico) manage to survive threats of starvation, drowning and the worst scourges the continent could throw at them without the ability to trade with Indian tribes? Two-thirds into her novel, Lalami disputes the discrepancies in the official record: "They omitted the torture and rapes they had witnessed," Estebanico writes. "They justified the thefts of food and supplies. They left out the Indian wives they married."

"Researching this novel showed me how malleable history is," Lalami says. "Estebanico is mentioned in the Cabeza de Vaca's book as a minor footnote, as a translator between the Spanish conquistadors and the Indians. Now, think about it: He's the most powerful person there.
