When the eighth annual Festival of the Arts Boca begins on Thursday night, it will do so with help from virtuoso violinist Itzhak Perlman, one of the headlining acts set to visit the Mizner Park Amphitheater (590 Plaza Real, Boca Raton) through March 15. Perlman, who has 15 Grammys, four Emmys and a Kennedy Center Honors award, will perform at a 7:30 p.m. concert conducted by Constantine Kit-sopoulos. The program will include Mendelssohn's "A Midsummer Night's Dream Overture, Op. 21," Beethoven's

"Symphony No. 5 in C minor, Op. 67" and Mendelssohn's "Violin Concerto in E minor, Op. 64." ### Sunday

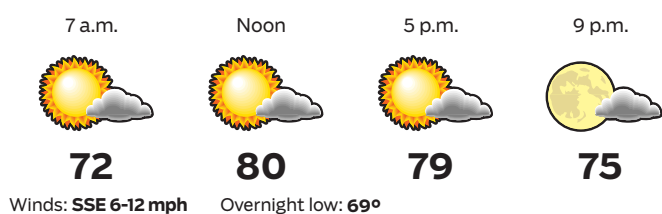

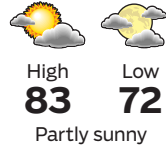
### John Matthews' outlook

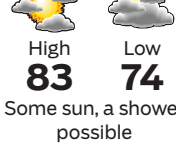

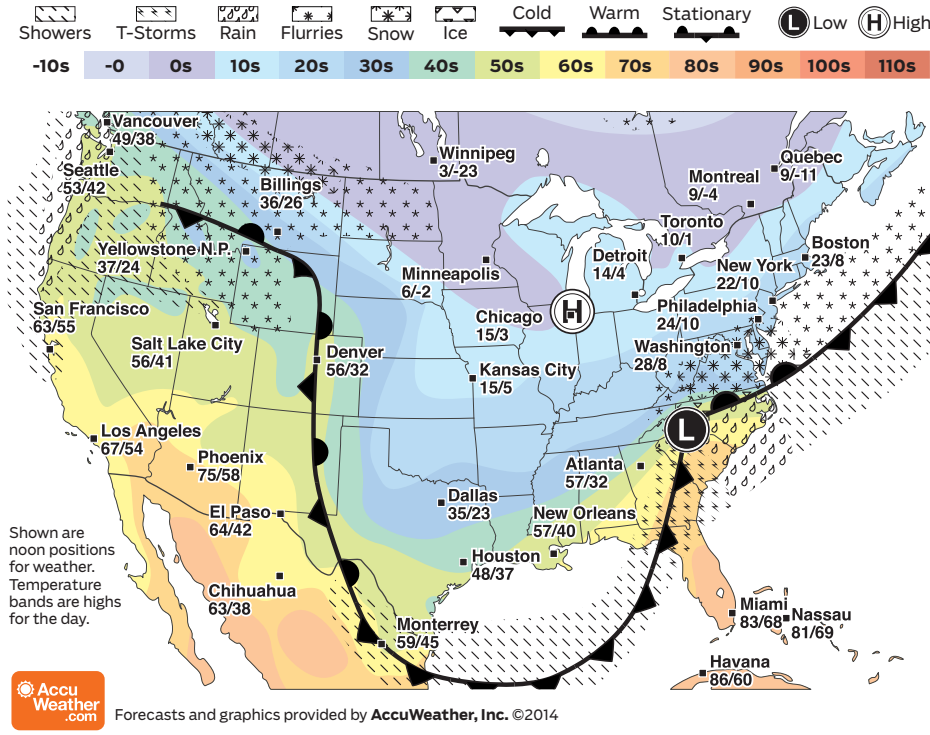
