# Barbies, boys and BFFs

### Formed on 'The X Factor,' award-winning Fifth Harmony brings playful pop to the Parker Playhouse

There is now a Barbie doll named after Lauren Jauregui, and one for each of her Fifth Harmony bandmates. The pop group's current single, "Sledgehammer," has garnered more than 20 million views on YouTube. They've won all kinds of odd music awards, and on Feb. 27, they embarked on a headlining concert tour.

And, yes, all five singers are 21 or younger. They'll perform Saturday, March 7, at Parker Playhouse in Fort Lauderdale.

Jauregui, 18, of Miami, and her compatriots came together after auditioning as solo acts for the 2012 season of "The X Factor" on Fox. Producer Simon Cowell said while none of the girls was compelling enough to embark on a solo tour, they all

were good singers. Cowell lumped them together, and as a group, the singers take turns singing lead on girl-powered anthems backed by heavily produced music. Though they finished third on "The X Factor," the formula has earned them a solid spot on pop radio and onstage, and they've opened for such acts as Demi Lovato.

"The audition and 'The X Factor' process helped us prepare for what we do now," Jauregui says. "You might think that it's less nerve-racking because there are no auditions, but it's still sort of nerve-racking. You never know if you're going to mess up."

Jauregui has received plenty of solo attention on the Internet, much of it by being romantically linked with the Vamps' Brad Simpson. They were coy about acknowledging a relationship until

breaking up in January, when they revealed they'd been dating for eight months.

Fifth Harmony won 2014 Disney Radio Awards, including Breakout Artist of the Year, and the group's song, "Miss Movin' On," won for Best Song To Rock Out To With Your BFF. The group also was nominated for six Teen Choice Awards. Mattel chose them to sing the "Anything Is Possible" brand anthem for Barbie, and a Barbie Fifth Harmony Lauren hit stores last fall. Lauren's fellow bandmates/Barbies include Dinah Jane Hansen, Ally Brooke Hernandez, Camila Cabello and Normani Kordei.

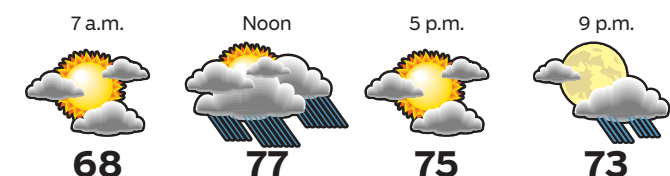

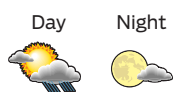


### John Matthews' outlook
