Annual Festival continues through March 16 with exciting performances, speakers

What: It's not too late to enjoy the excitement of the 10th Annual Festival of the Arts BOCA, presented by the Schmidt Family Centre for the Arts, through March 16.

On March 9, Laila Lalami will talk about her novel. The Moor's Account, an account of the Spanish exploration of Florida and the Gulf Coast that was a finalist for the 2015 Pulitzer Prize. Lalami is a regular contributor to The Nations, Newsweek and The Los Angeles Times.

On Friday, March 11, the Festival will welcome 12-vear old jazz piano prodigy and two-time Grammy

nominated Joev Alexander, who was also recently featured on "60 Minutes," in the Florida premiere of the Joey Alexander Trio, presenting a night of symphonic jazz with The Symphonia, Boca Raton and Constantine Kitsopoulos.
