Ushering in sweet sound of Jazz in the Gardens

Arguably the strongest lineup the Jazz in the Gardens Music Festival has ever presented, Sunday's bill brings avant-garde singer Janelle Monáe, R&B artist Usher and Kenny "Babyface" Edmonds to Sun Life Stadium (247 Don Shula Drive, Miami Gardens). That's after Saturday's show, which includes no less than Aretha Franklin, Kool and the Gang and Michael McDonald. Usher, the eight-time Grammy winner, is the headliner, and he's coming off yet another Top 20 hit last year with "I Don't Mind," featuring Juicy J. \$65-\$90 via Ticketmaster.com. Wednesday

The man picked to close out the 10th edition of Festival of the Arts Boca on Wednesday night, Joshua Bell, bears a musical instrument arguably more famous than he is: a 303-year-old Stradivarius violin. The Stradivarius, which will accompany Bell's 7 p.m. program at Mizner Park Amphitheater (590 Plaza Real, Boca Raton), carries a striking, cinematic history, involving thievery by the Nazis in the 1930s. Friday

As of March 10, a handful of \$1,249 VIP passes remain (\$349 general admission is sold out) for Ultra Music Festival 2016. So if you happen to keep the cost equivalent of a MacBook Air in your bank account, know that this Friday-Sunday smorgasbord of raver-friendly electronica boasts a strong lineup, with Friday DJ sets by Martin Garrix, Armin Van Buuren, Kaskade, Miike Snow, Carl Cox and John Digweed, all under the bandshell and colorful LED boards of Bayfront Park (301 Biscayne Blvd., Miami). We're also digging '90s rap-rock electronica veterans the Prodigy, whose Saturday set should lean on their 2015 album "The Day Is My Enemy"; and David Guetta and Purity Ring on Sunday. People without tickets can stream the festival at UltraMusicFestival.com. 4 p.m.-midnight Friday, noon-midnight Saturday, noon-11 p.m. Sunday.

Saturday

We don't know about you, but sizzling, heartburn-inducing pork puts us in the mood for blues. This is why we're thankful for the greased-up throwdown called the Delray Beach Bacon and Bourbon Festival, returning Saturday to Old School Square (51 N. Swinton Ave.) with smoky spirits and music by Jay Blues Band and Grace and the Victory Riders. A highlight of the festival, of course, is the Pappy Van Winkle tastings (8 p.m., and it's \$300), but also the flood of seminars, pairings and chef demos that accompany the food vendors. This year brings a pork assault of bacon and bourbon burgers, bacon garlic fries, pork pot pie with a creamy béchamel and Dr. Pepper-and-bourbon-glazed pork belly with bok choy. 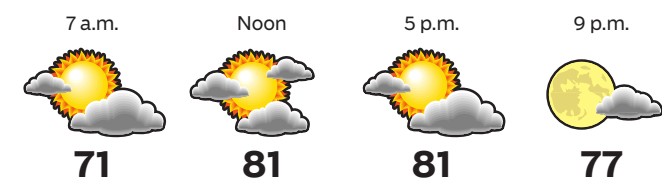
